Set clear limits and establish firm, but fair expectations. Role model good behaviors including attending school every day and being on time.

Discuss their four year and beyond plan college, trade or specialty school? — talk to the school counselor Communicate with teachers: attend open house, conferences and utilize their email or websites. Login to Parent Portal & Request access to student's Schoology pages

Provide nutritious meals & encourage regular exercise & consistent, quality sleep

Talk about the dangers of alcohol, tobacco & other drug use & social media; role play these scenarios & discuss consequences



NWEA...Test results DO matter!



- Students core classes will be pre-scheduled based on NWEA test score results. Test results are a reliable predictor of student's success. NWEA scores along with grades, & teacher input allow our CV Data Team to place students.
- Students will also be pre-scheduled in to accelerated classes (except AP World History). <u>Previous Recommended NWEA scores</u>:

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Advanced English = Reading RIT 234 and above

Accelerated Math = Math RIT 239 and above

AP World History = Reading RIT 234 and above

Honors Biology = Reading RIT 228 & Math RIT 234 and above

** And always encourage your student to take NWEA test seriously!!

Math Focus & English Support...why students benefit from this help

Students are pre-scheduled in these support classes if scored in the 35% or below on recent NWEA

- Develops a strong math base 4 years of math credit required for high school graduation
- English support/block is determined by the student's lexile & focuses on increasing the students reading level
- Develops stronger reading/writing skills, which is beneficial in ALL subject areas.
- Prevents failing Algebra or English and having to repeat a course

Advanced Placement World History



An additional .5 bump in the class grade will be awarded to students who take an AP class and pass the course. Pending AP exam score, some colleges will award credit.

Testing Out



- Provides students with the opportunity to demonstrate competence in specific high school subject areas by taking an end-of-term exam for that specific high school subject area.
- Students <u>must</u> earn <u>78%</u> or better on the comprehensive final exam in order to earn credit and be placed in a higher-level course. Other materials may be required.

 Forms accompanied by your four-year plan are due to the Community Education

 Office prior to 4/30/24 when registration closes.
- Testing takes place in June 2024 at Mohegan High School. If student passes the exam with a 78% or higher, their schedule will be changed to reflect the new class.
- Note Credits earned through testing out may NOT be accepted by some colleges/universities.



Encourage Good Study Habits to Maintain Good Grades!

- 1. Insist on your student ATTENDING EVERY DAY; to be attentive & put phone away!
- 2. Communicate with their teachers, check Schoology & PowerSchool pages for updates
- 3. Encourage studying nightly. Even if "homework" isn't given, students should spend about 20 minutes on each subject reviewing.
- 4. Provide a place free of distraction for your student to study. Do NOT allow them to study in front of the TV or with their phone.
- 5. Encourage homework completion! Ignoring assignments = poor/failing grades! Use any extra time in school to get started on homework.
- 6. Help your student get organized. Consider using Apps such as Sigma Planner, My Study Life, myHomework Student Planner, Remember the Milk and Focus Keeper)
- 7. Utilize FREE tutoring resources, such as www.khanacademy.org and after school Homework Club offered at CVHS.
- 8. Remember the importance of rest, relaxation, exercise, and a proper diet.

If a student fails a core class, it MUST be repeated! Encourage success the first time!


