


How do I request to meet with my counselor?

Name on your diploma

- The name on the diploma must match PowerSchool and birth certificate. (example, John E. Doe).
- Request changes filling out a Change Form in the Counseling office or by emailing your counselor.
- Deadline for change requests is 10/31/23.
- Once we place the order for the diplomas then it will be final.



Graduation and diploma


In June, <u>All</u> 22 credits in the required subjects to participate in the commencement ceremony

On track for graduation? <u>at least</u> 16 credits at the start of your senior year

Short credits? Make sure you are working with your counselor on a graduation plan

Look to PowerSchool now and often

- Make sure grades are accurate.
- If you <u>retook</u> a course and don't see an "R" grade that replaces the lower grade, contact your counselor.
- Check the "Graduation Progress" screen for required courses.
- Address any questions about grades teachers or your counselor.



Senior grades matter!

Graduation with Honors is based on the cumulative GPA following 1st semester in January.

Check your transcript for any errors...if you retook a class for a higher grade make sure the previous grade is replaced with an "R" on your transcript.

Graduating with Honors? Students with:

- 3.50 to 3.74 are Cum Laude
- 3.75 to 3.89 are Magna Cum Laude
- 3.90 to 4.00(+) graduate with highest honors or Suma Cum Laude.




Things to consider when choosing 4-year college?



What major or course of study?





Urban, suburban, or rural?

Living on campus or commuting from home?

Most important: affordability of tuition/cost?

What about a community college?

- Transfer to a "4 year" college and save thousands
- Complete an "2 year" degree in a career area
- Earn a certificate for a specific work skill
- Start an apprenticeship

How to apply for admission to college:

- Apply to 3 to 5 colleges.
- Remember most will have application fees (fee waivers are available students in need)
- Complete the college's online application
- Send your transcript (grades) through Parchment: http://cvhsguida nce.weebly.com/transcripts.html
- Request to have your official SAT/ACT score sent to the colleges – many are still test optional







When applying, most colleges will look at your GPA, high school courses and test scores.

Some colleges will require these things:







You will apply to most through their website. A few colleges will ask for the Common App and fewer will give you the choice of using the Coalition App



- Always follow "how to apply" info on your college's admissions website.
- The Common App and Coalition App can be used to apply to several colleges at once.
- Both applications are complicated, and you should do your research before submitting.
- The Common App has a longer track record and is accepted at more schools, if you are trying to decide which one to use.




After you apply, the college will need your official high school transcript (grades from CVHS).

Go to **Parchment.com** and set up an account.

There is no fee for this service until after you graduate from CVHS.

SAT test

- SAT scores are on CollegeBoard.org account
- When applying to college, send official scores from your CollegeBoard.org account. Fees apply.
- Colleges use best score when making decisions.

Retaking the SAT? Considering the ACT?

- Students can use their CollegeBoard.org accounts to find and register for a future SAT date and location.
- Available SAT test centers are difficult to find.
- ACT Test is equally accepted by colleges. Finding a test center and date may be as difficult as finding an SAT but it is another option. Register on www.actstudent.org

- AP test scores from previous years should be sent to the college for credit consideration directly from CollegeBoard.org.
- Fees apply to sending score reports so wait to send until after settled on a college in the spring.



College bound athletes need to be up to speed on the requirements of the NCAA and NAIA. Talk to Mr. Merchant in the Counseling Office for help.





The wait for an admissions decision...

After you apply, one of four things could happen:

- 1. Admit: you're in and have to figure out how to pay for college.
- 2. Defer: the college is going to make a decision about you later, usually after you send your 1st semester senior grades.
- 3. Waitlist: the college likes you but does not have space for you and the chances are usually slim.
- 4. Deny: The college's loss...you will be fine somewhere else.



After submitting your application, make sure to check your admissions account and your email. You will have to make sure the college receives everything they need to make a decision about you, like official SAT scores.

If you are accepted, you have until May 1st to commit to attend. Some colleges may encourage you to send an enrollment deposit to reserve your spot. BEELINA AND AND ADDRESS OF THE BEELINA AND ADDRE continue on M

Counselors will help you get started on your college/career plans.

- First week of October, your English teacher will bring your class to a presentation.
- While there, Counselors will help you get started on your college applications, order transcripts, and provide career direction.



Financial Aid is available to those who apply and don't miss deadlines.

"Need based financial aid" are loans, work study, and grants.

"Merit based financial aid" is determined by grades, test scores, or athletic (or other) abilities.

The Federal Government and the State of Michigan administer financial aid programs.

The FAFSA application is a must for every student and should be completed by March 1 but sooner is better.

The FAFSA application opens December 1st.




