


How to request courses for your Sophomore Year!

Use this form to plan and then to go over your requests when you meet with your counselor in March.




Notes:

Xello is our career exploration platform. You can get to your account through "Class Link".







Next...visit PowerSchool to see what required courses are left to complete.

Check "Graduation Progress" button on PowerSchool now and after every semester.

How many credits do I need to earn my diploma and participate in the graduation commencement ceremony at the end of my Senior year?



Credits: Are you on track to graduate with your class?

You should have at least 1.0 credit right now (2nd Sem, Freshman Year)

At the end of this school year you should have at least 4.0 credits.





If I am short credits, what are my options for credit recovery?

- After school day, CVS Credit Recovery with Community Ed at Mohegan (\$\$)
- After school day, online courses through an out of district provider (\$\$\$)
- Summer School Programs (\$\$)
- CVHS Credit Recovery lab during the school day (one less elective spot on your schedule)




Download the current <u>CVHS Course Offerings</u> <u>Book</u> from our school's website.

Read course descriptions carefully.



Your 10th grade English, Math, Science and Social Studies courses are assigned by the school based on your grades and test scores.

You will see the recommended courses when you meet with your counselor in March.



If you would like to make changes to the recommended required courses, you will need to complete a change form and have your parent's permission.

The form is available online and in the Guidance Office. The deadline for making changes is April 1st.



If you didn't take Health as a Freshman, you should consider taking it as a Sophomore or plan to take it later.



Two credits of a single World Language is required.


Students who complete a CTE program or take an additional credit of Visual/Performing Arts and Applied Arts may waive the 2nd credit requirement.

If you are a Band or Choir student, request the course your teacher recommends.

If there are auditions for different course levels, those changes will be made at the end of this school year.













Elective courses are available in every department and in many subjects. Explore interests and develop skills.

AP Application Form required for each course and are available from CVHS Guidance and Counseling. Deadline to apply is April 1st! We ask that students commit to staying in AP courses all year! **No dropping!**

There are several ways to earn College Credit while in high school:



- Advanced Placement (AP) Exams (Application due by April 1st)
- Articulation Agreements (talk to CTE teacher for details)
- Dual Enrollment (Mandatory meeting for interested students and parents on March 25, 2024 at 7pm in CVHS Auditorium)

Make sure you list acceptable Alternative Selections at the bottom of your Course Request Form because you just might get that course.

In other words: Pick a good backup plan.



Why is it so difficult to change my schedule after the school year starts?

- Teachers are assigned to the courses that you (students) request.
- High school schedules are like a big puzzle...changing course impacts another.
- That's why we can't honor special requests for teachers, lunches, etc.
- Visit our "Schedule Changes" web page for details about schedule changes.

When will my high school schedule be available to view?

Your counselor may talk with you in June if there is a problem with your schedule that needs to be resolved.

Otherwise, you are most likely to see your schedule in August at Big Red Check-In.





Key to a successful course request:

- 1. Look at your career goals.
- 2. Use a 4 year plan and updated EDP.
- 3. Review the CVHS Course Book.
- 4. Talk to teachers and parents.
- 5. Get necessary signatures on the required forms.
- 6. Don't miss the deadlines.
